
DISTRIBUTION OF LICENCE FEES FOR DOCUMENT DELIVERY

September 2016

BACKGROUND

These licence fees are for articles supplied by companies that provide document delivery services for their clients. Copyright Agency licenses these services to supply members' articles in accordance with authority from its members.

The total amount for distribution is approximately \$85,602:

- Ebsco: \$24,371 (October 2014 to September 2015)
- ProQuest \$27,568 (January to December 2015)
- Australian Wine Research Institute (AWRI): \$32,782 (January 2005 to March 2012)
- ACER: \$881 (September 2011 to June 2015)

DATA FOR DISTRIBUTION

ProQuest, Ebsco and ACER provide Copyright Agency with data about works supplied under their document delivery services. AWRI provided a sample of usage data from its online library service from 2012 to 2014, which Copyright Agency supplemented with recipients from previous distributions of AWRI licence fees.

ALLOCATION OF LICENCE FEES

Licence fees are allocated to rightsholders who have authorised Copyright Agency to license their works for inclusion in the document delivery services. Recipients are required to check that allocations to them align with their rights, and to share payments in accordance with their contractual obligations.
