Frequently asked questions

When will my exhibition be presented at 4A?

The exhibition and public programs at 4A Centre for Contemporary Asian Art will be programmed from September 2022 to November 2022. The exhibition will be presented for a minimum of five (5) weeks during this period.

When will my exhibition at 4A be announced?

The successful artist/s will be announced in August 2021. The exhibition will also be announced in 4A's 2022 program announcement, which is scheduled for November 2021.

Who will curate my exhibition at 4A?

Your exhibition will be curated by **4A Artistic Director/CEO Amrit Gill**, with support from the 4A curatorial team.

Where will my exhibition be presented?

Your exhibition will be presented at 4A's gallery: 181–187 Hay Street, Haymarket NSW.

How do I find out more about 4A's gallery and what is possible in the space?

Please contact 4A for images and a floorplan of the Hay Street gallery, and more information on what is possible. For your exhibition, you will be able to use the ground floor and first floor gallery spaces. Special permission will be required for work presented on the exterior of the building.

Is the \$80,000 commission paid entirely to the successful artist/s?

The total value of the commission is \$80,000 and includes a \$20,000 fee paid directly to the artist/s.

The exhibition budget will be finalised in consultation with 4A and will be managed by 4A's curatorial team.

Is this opportunity open only to artists of Asian heritage?

The CAP Commission at 4A is open only to artists who identify as Asian or being from Asian ancestry. Applicants must be Australian citizens or permanent residents.
