LICENCE FEES FROM SCHOOLS: JUNE 2023 DISTRIBUTION

BACKGROUND

In 2022, Copyright Agency reached agreement with the Copyright Advisory Group (CAG) for the school sector (CAG), for the three-year period from 1 January 2023 to 31 December 2025, with an option to renew for a further year. The agreement sets a flat rate of \$13 per student each year.

Surveys in schools ceased in March 2020 due to the pandemic. CAG and Copyright Agency agreed in 2017 to work together, from 2018, on new methods of data collection using modern technologies that, among other things, reduce teacher burden. The parties agreed that if new methods were not finalised by September 2020, either party could apply to the Copyright Tribunal for assistance. Copyright Agency applied to the Copyright Tribunal in May 2021, and the parties are continuing to work with the Tribunal to get new methods of data collection in place.

CHANGES SINCE THE 2022 DISTRIBUTION

The dataset for the distribution will include:

- survey data from schools from 2016 rather than 2015 (to March 2020)
- titles from a questionnaire completed by teachers in 2022 (as well as titles from 2021)
- updated data from Nielsen BookScan, for titles published from 2020
- titles from the Educational Lending Right Scheme
